Mohill

Mohill is a former market town, located 15 minutes east of Carrick on Shannon, just off on the main N4 Sligo-Dublin Route. The town is home to the Lough Rynn Castle Estate and the Nick Faldo designed golf club and is also on the Lough Rynn Navigation route.

• Located just off the national primary route within 10 minutes of the rail network and 70 minutes of the Ireland West International and Sligo Regional airports.







Dromahair

Dromahair is a picturesque town located in North Leitrim on the shores of the River Bonnet at the mouth of Lough Gill and near the famous Parkes Castle. The town has a distinctive appearance with its planned streetscape incorporating natural stone and native trees and many historical features.

- Located a short distance from the main N4 Sligo-Dublin and the N16 Sligo-Enniskillen routes and just 25 minutes from the Gateway town of Sligo. It has access to rail and Sligo airport within 25 minutes and is under 2 hours from Derry airport.
- A new treatment plant will allow the town cater for a continued influx of new residential activity and new business activity.
- Access to broadband.
- It has a young, active Development Association who have been involved in a number of projects to further enhance the town including the development of a Riverside walk and the running of the Depot, a community resource centre.
- Good quality childcare and primary school and close proximity to Sligo (10 miles) for secondary schools and special education schools and Sligo IT.
- Renowned for its heritage, landscape and tourism assets.
- Convenient access to a number of top quality restaurants as well as being the location for the Abbey Manor Hotel.
- Gaelic pitch, playground, library and youth activities.

Manorhamilton

Manorhamilton is the largest town in North Leitrim. Its landscape surpasses that of many other well known scenic locations in Ireland such as Killarney or Connemara, yet is not over exposed to visitors.

- Located on the N16 Sligo- Belfast route, 40 minutes from Sligo Regional airport.
- Base to a number of companies including door veneer and automotive mirror manufacturing exporting companies as

well as being one of the main centres for the Health Services in the North West.

- A very active business association who have been involved in developing the one-stop shop for services in the town.
- A very large Community Resource Centre which is the office base for a number of organisations as well as providing a gym and leisure facilities, outdoor sports area, childcare facilities and also hosts meetings and events for groups of up to 250 people.
- The Leitrim Sculpture centre and the Glens Centre are based in this highly artistic community which attracts people in to view the high quality sculpture and events which are hosted here.
- The Organic Centre which provides courses all year round is also located nearby.
- A number of quality restaurants and shops which are dotted throughout the cobble stoned town centre.
